Our current situation during the pandemic has highlighted the need for outdoor learning spaces. The School Advisory Council decided to use funds to purchase the materials that are necessary for creating an outdoor classroom. A focus on incorporating a space for outdoor learning. One outdoor classroom has been created using tree stumps that were donated by a community member. Staff is currently working on completing the outdoor classroom using the concrete seating that was purchased. This will provide opportunities in the future for continued outdoor learning.
