<ul> <li>SAC grant from last year has been spent.</li> <li>Grant should be refreshed. 5000/school + \$1 for every student</li> <li>Student Support Grant- (\$5000 per school plus \$1 per student (Sept 30 enrolment)) The Student Support Grant provides funds to schools in order to off-set fundraising pressures many parents and schools face. The Student Support Grant is to be used for activities or events that a school would normally fundraise for and that have a direct benefit to students. Examples include but are not limited to: class trips, school supplies, participation in student competitions, and uniforms/equipment for school sports teams, guest speakers, and school events.</li> <li>Healthy Schools Grant- (\$5000 per school plus \$1 per student (Sept 30 enrolment)) The goal of the grant is to enhance students' health and well-being, support academic achievement and student success. It is intended to help build connectedness within the school community and promote students' sense of cultural safety and belonging that is fundamental to inclusive education. The grant can be used to increase fitness and physical activity opportunities, reduce sedentary behaviour, increase access to cultural experiences, and engage students in outdoor learning to support their mental health and wellness.</li> </ul>	SAC was made aware of the different grants available to schools along with a short description of the criteria for spending.
